Telemann's (Ir)regular Ritornellos or, Durational Idioms in Baroque Phrase Rhythm

## **Abstract**

Telemann's Ritornellos are known for their frequent metrical irregularity, and they include many apparent repetitions and suffixes that seem to place them outside the metrical grid and endow them with a decidedly rustic quality. In this paper I explore internal expansions and contractions within the components of these ritornellos as the source for the appearance of irregularity in them. Examples are drawn from *Musique de table*, the opera Emma und Eginhard, and other instrumental works. The paper concludes with what is likely the first known Brahms-Telemann borrowing: the third movement of the C minor String Quartet is based on a passage from Telemann's Eb Trio Sonata from *Musique de table*.
